Resolution of the Government of Georgia No. 231

28 June 2012

on regulating individual issues related to registration of titles to agricultural land plots and perfection of cadastral data on the territory of Georgia

Article 1. In accordance with Article 12 of the Law of Georgia on Normative Acts, Article 6 of the Law of Georgia on the Structure, Competences and Rules of Operation of the Government of Georgia, and Article 6(t) of the Appendix to the Resolution of the Government of Georgia No. 509 dated 29 December 2011, some of the individual issues related to registration of titles to agricultural land plots and perfection of cadastral information shall be regulated as follows:

- 1. The Public Law Entity "National Agency of Public Register" shall not charge any service fee for registering title to an agricultural land plot or any changes in the registration data if cadastral data specified in accordance with the Regulations of Public Register exist concerning the land plot subject to registration.
- 2. The Public Law Entity "National Agency of Public Register" is hereby tasked with ensuring that the cadastral data, which the current registrations rely on, are made compatible with the requirements established by the applicable legislation. For the purpose of performing this task, the Public Law Entity "National Agency of Public Register" is hereby authorized to conclude contracts with physical persons and legal entities.
- 3. The total cost for making cadastral information compatible with the legal requirements (including the taxes payable under law) shall be fixed at no more than three (3) Georgian Lari per each land plot, which shall be payable by the Public Law Entity "National Agency of Public Register".
- 4. The rule contained in this Article shall not apply to registration of agricultural land plots, which are located within the administrative boundaries of any self-governing town or on the recreational territories.

Article 2. This Resolution shall enter into force immediately upon its publication.
